9:00 – 10:30 Jose Antonio Esquibel – Keynote: The Lujan Family of 17th-century NM: Facts, Fiction, and Unanswered Questions

The genealogy of the Lujan family may seem straightforward at first glance. Once you delve into the details and look at primary documentation, confusion sets in. To help clarify the Lujan family genealogy, José Antonio initiated The Lujan Project, which involved several volunteers via Facebook. The findings, extracted from primary 17th-century records, will be shared in this presentation, including proven genealogical groupings and clarification on what remains undocumented.

This class will highlight some of the best ways you can use the FamilySearch website to locate your Hispanic ancestors. 1:30-3:00 Francisco Sisneros - Bridging the Rio Arriba and the Rio Abajo: The Records and Pobladores of the Rio Abajo.

One hundred years ago the eminent linguist and folklorist Aurelio Macedonio Espinosa mapped out the eventual domain of the families who entered New Mexico with Juan de Oñate and Diego de Vargas. The domain began at the headwaters of the Rio Grande in the San Luis Valley of southern Colorado and meandered down through the historical Rio Arriba and opened up into the Rio Abajo. This presentation will trace the families and the records of these families from the Rio Arriba who settled the Rio Abajo beginning in the early 18th century.

3:00 – 4:30 Henrietta M. Christmas – San Miguel del Bado, Land Grant, Borderland and Gateway.

This area was first opened up in 1794 to settlers from Santa Fe who wanted to venture further east and have lands available for their sheep herding and crops; 52 families were granted lands at SMB, take a look at an eastern migration, who they were and why everyone forded the river at the village of San Miguel.
